

Regulatory Sensory Processing Workshop Objectives

Participants will be able to:

- Define sensory processing and regulation
- Explain how sensory regulation promotes the development of :
 - Joint attention
 - Two-way social interaction
 - Language
 - The ability to interpret gestural social cues and facial expressions
 - Logical thinking and problem-solving
- State how child-caregiver relationships and the use of affect impact a child's social and language learning
- Understand the concept of the whole child – sensory, affective, emotional, motor, and language development in the context of their relationships with others and with their world
- Explain the importance of treating the whole child based on individual differences, as opposed to using a segmented or hierarchical approach
- Describe treatment techniques that support the development of functional communication using the whole child approach
